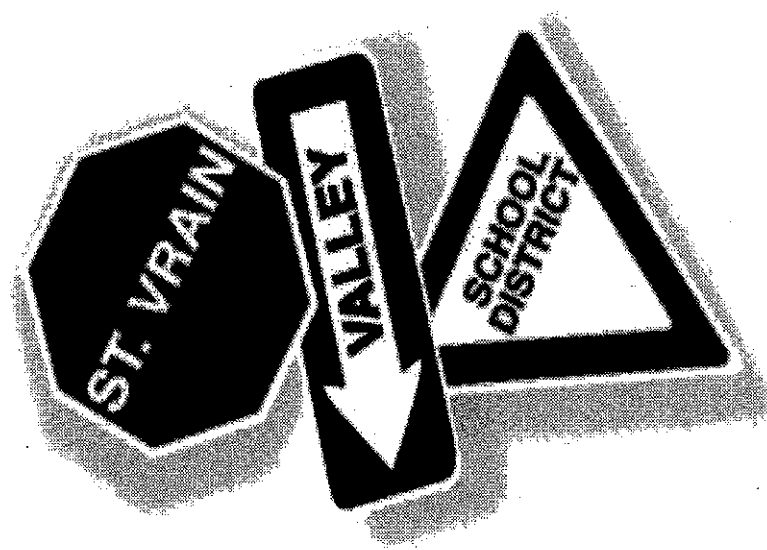

Course Description/Credit/Class Availability

- The course includes individualized instruction and training in techniques such as perceptual skills, troubleshooting and defensive driving practice in a variety of driving situations.
- 30 hours of classroom time. Emphasis is on both the fundamental skills and the proper attitudes that contribute to responsible driving.
- Textbooks used are approved by the Colorado Department of Revenue, Motor Vehicle Business group, and the Driver License Section.
- Students receive a .25 credit hour graded on a Pass-Fail scale on their SVVSD transcript.
- The course is open to all licensed and non-licensed students who meet the current age requirements (**14 years 6 months, or older on the FIRST day of class**).
- Driver Education instructors are certified to administer the permit test which is given during the last class, at no additional charge.
- Behind-the-Wheel driving consists of 6 hours of instruction on the street. This includes the following environments: heavy traffic (Longmont and Boulder), freeway driving, mountain driving, country driving and open highway driving. **The student will be notified when he/she is scheduled for the BTW training, after completion of the class and the permit has been obtained.**

Class Fee

- The Driver Education class fee of **\$395** includes 30 hours of classroom and 6 hours of Behind-the-Wheel instruction. The fee is due at the first class session. The student may bring cash or a check made payable to **Driver Education** to the class. Credit cards are accepted via the Revtrak system at <https://stvrain.revtrak.net/tek9.asp>

Behind-the-wheel Training

- Behind-the-Wheel training is available without taking the 30-hour class. This meets the State requirement of training for students who have taken an online course. The cost is **\$275** for 6 hours of training.

Current Laws Governing Drivers Licenses in Colorado

- The minimum age for obtaining an Instruction permit is 15 years old, provided that the student has completed a 30-hour Driver's Education class. An affidavit of completion will be given to the student the last day of classes. Each student must also complete the 6-hour driving portion of the class prior to obtaining a license.
- An Instruction permit must be held at least 12 months before applying for a Colorado Driver's License.
- Permit holders must complete and log 50 hours of supervised driving before applying for a Colorado Driver's License.
- A certificate of completion, which certifies the completion of the 6-hour driving portion of the course, must be presented to the Driver's License Bureau to apply for the license.
- **Students must be 14 years 6 months of age or older on the FIRST day of class.**
- A Driving skills test must be passed at the DMV or with us prior to a license being issued. Only the DMV can issue a license or permit.
- Driver Education instructors are certified to administer the skills test for a driver's license. The cost is **\$40** for students and **\$60** for adults.
- **Driver Awareness Classes**
A 4-hour class will be available to students at least **15 years 6 months of age** (who do not yet have a permit), which enables the student to obtain a permit before 16.
- This class will be offered every 3rd Thursday of the month starting in September. Cost is \$65. Enrollment must be sufficient to offer class. Class meets from 4:00-8:15 pm at the CDC campus (1200 S. Sunset), in the Horticulture building.
